## **OVERVIEW**

The Marblehead Garden Club, organized in 1926 and founded in 1927, is the oldest garden club in Marblehead. The Club, a volunteer organization, is united by a passion for gardening, history, education, and community service. Since 1936, at the request of the Marblehead Historical Society (now known as the Marblehead Museum), the Club has cared for and cultivated the gardens surrounding the 1768 Lee Mansion. Since no information about Lee's actual gardens has ever been discovered, the Club has completed extensive research to produce gardens suitable for a prominent ship owner and town official such as Jeremiah Lee. The Club continues to study 18<sup>th</sup>-century gardens throughout New England and also researches periodicals, letters, books, and diaries from the period to provide historical accuracy in terms of the garden's design and the types of plants selected. Club members volunteer countless hours in the garden and hold fundraisers such as annual plant sales, special garden tours, and holiday wreath sales to support the Lee Mansion Gardens. Over the years, the Club has also supported a wide variety of civic and community service projects, which include eradicating Ragweed in the 1930s and 1940s and re-treeing Abbot Hall in the 1970s.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The archives of the Marblehead Garden Club consist of documents, artifacts, slides, and photographs of the Club's board records, programs, events, and community service projects. The board records include club history, by-laws, agenda, meeting minutes, annual reports, and membership records. The records of the Club's programs, events, and community service projects include publications, publicity, news clippings, program booklets, and invitations related to its plant sales, garden tours, wreath sales, and other programs. The collection also includes garden maintenance records for the Garden Implementation Committee and the Garden Advisory Committee. The garden design plans include those by Paul R. Frost, Shurcliff, Shurcliff & Merrill, Isadore Smith - aka Ann Leighton, Diane Kostial-McGuire, and Patricia Pratt. The collection also include material from the colonial study group and about the plant selections and landscape history at the Lee Mansion.
