BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

Joseph Lindsey was the progenitor of the Marblehead, Massachusetts, branch of the Lindsey family. He was born to Ralph and Mary Lindsey on September 23, 1714, in Lynn, Massachusetts, and he worked as a joiner in Marblehead. He married Rebecca Hendley in 1739, and they had five children: Mary, Sarah, Nathaniel, Rebecca, and Benjamin. Joseph Lindsey died on August 31, 1764, in Marblehead.

Nathaniel Lindsey Sr. was born on March 2, 1746, in Marblehead, the son of Joseph and Rebecca (Hendley) Lindsey. In 1775 he was in Capt. Francis Felton's company for Coast Defense, and in 1776 he served in Col. Timothy Pickering's Regiment. Several of his vessels served as privateers during the American Revolution. He served the town of Marblehead in several capacities, including tax collector, constable, selectman, and coroner. Nathaniel married Sarah Lee in 1767; they had four children: Joseph, Nathaniel, Sarah, and Rebecca. Nathaniel Lindsey Sr. died in Marblehead on August 20, 1798.

Nathaniel Lindsey Jr. was born in Marblehead on March 17, 1771, the son of Nathaniel and Sarah (Lee) Lindsey. He was a mariner like his father and was active in privateering during the War of 1812-1815. In 1812 he commanded the schooner *Growler* with a crew of Marblehead men. In 1829, sailing as master of the ship *Candace*, he was captured by pirates. He served as selectman in Marblehead in 1837 and as Postmaster from 1838 to 1841. Nathaniel married Sarah Barker, and they had six children: Nathaniel, Sarah, John Barker, Joseph, Benjamin, Mary, and Rebecca. Nathaniel Lindsey Jr. died in Marblehead on September 12, 1842.

Benjamin Hendley was born on August 8, 1672, in Marblehead, the son of Elias and Sarah (Thompson) Hendley. He was a mariner and shoreman in Marblehead. With his first wife Miriam, Hendley had one son: John; and with his second wife Mary he had two children: Nathaniel, and Rebecca, who married Joseph Lindsey in 1739. Benjamin Hendley died in Marblehead in 1764.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection spans five generations of the Lindsey family of Marblehead, Massachusetts. Included are Continental Army documents, shipping and privateering papers, Marblehead town records, bills and receipts, account books, business and personal correspondence, and estate papers. Also present are papers of Benjamin Hendley, related by marriage to the Lindseys. The collection is divided into six series.

SERIES I. Nathaniel Lindsey Sr. (1746-1798) **Papers** contains the major portion of this collection. Papers from 1775-1776 primarily document Lindsey's service in the Continental Army, while papers from following years deal primarily with privateering, and in particular with the brig *Terrible*. Included among the town of Marblehead papers are court cases, coroners' cases, tax collections, and accounts. Also present are account books and ledgers, and many bills and receipts spanning Lindsey's career.

SERIES II. Nathaniel Lindsey Jr. (1771-1842) **Papers** contains shipping and privateering papers from vessels captained by Nathaniel Lindsey Jr., in particular the ships *American Hero* and *Print*; the brigs *Legal Tender*, *Ruthy*, *Four Sisters*, and *Victory*; and the schooner *Spring Bird*. There are also bills and receipts documenting his career and papers from his time as Postmaster in Marblehead.

SERIES III. Joseph Lindsey (1796-1853) Papers contains papers of Joseph Lindsey, nephew of Nathaniel Lindsey Jr. Included are papers from his ship *Trescott* and also personal letters exchanged with his wife Deliverance (Bridgeo) Lindsey and sons Joseph and Philip Lindsey. Also

present in Series III are two items from the Bridgeo family, a deed signed by Philip Bridgeo and a silver nameplate memorializing his wife Hannah (Knight) Bridgeo.

SERIES IV. Joseph W. Lindsey (1823-1902) and Philip B. Lindsey (1825-1900) Papers contains the papers of Joseph Lindsey's sons Joseph William Lindsey and Philip Bridgeo Lindsey. Many of the papers are signed by both brothers. The collection also includes the ledger from their schooner *Erie*.

SERIES V. Benjamin Hendley (1672-1764) Papers contains legal and estate papers petaining to Benjamin Hendley, father-in-law of Nathaniel Lindsey Sr. Hendley's estate was handled by his daughter Rebecca Lindsey and her son Nathaniel Lindsey and included are papers of Rebecca's. Also present are many accounts, receipts, and bills documenting Hendley's career as a shoreman in Marblehead.

SERIES VI. Other Papers in Lindsey Collection includes a few papers belonging to other members of the Lindsey family, and in particular Joseph (1714-1764). Other papers pertain to Joseph Potter, James Dennis, and John Prince, Marbleheaders who were contemporaries of Nathaniel Lindsey Sr. Finally, there are miscellaneous papers found in the collection. Of particular interest among the miscellaneous papers is an undated "Description of a House", containing detailed specifications for a house to be built by a Mr. Hooper.
